USS Arleigh Burke Association Members, Family and Friends,


Happy New Year! I trust that everyone is off to a good start in 2023!

On behalf of the USS Arleigh Burke Association Membership, we collectively THANK Mark for his significant contribution. Mark remains an Association Life Member!

Following are the highlights of the 2022 USS Arleigh Burke Association Annual Membership Meeting, which were also captured in Mark Fortune's Annual Membership Meeting Minutes posted on our Association Website:

- Rick Easton and Rob Jobrack were nominated for and elected to continue to serve as your President and Treasurer respectively. There was no nomination for Secretary. Following the Annual Membership Meeting, Kenyon Hiser volunteered to temporarily fill the Secretary position starting in January 2023 until a permanent replacement is found.
- Rob Jobrack reported that our bank balance is in good shape with all 2022 taxes paid, noting only a couple of small bills remain for the USS Arleigh Burke 31st Commissioning Anniversary Celebration.
- The Membership unanimously voted to continue support for the USS Arleigh Burke Association Anchor Scholarship for the 2023-2024 Academic Year at an increased level of \$3,000, with authorization for up to \$3,500 if Association Members and Friends Anchor Scholarship contributions are sufficient.
- The Membership unanimously voted to continue support for the Admiral Arleigh Burke Foundation and provide \$500 from the USS Arleigh Burke Association to assist Foundation costs in 2023.
- In 2023, we will conduct Association Board of Direc-

tor Telcons from 1930-2015 (7:30-8:15pm) on the third Thursday of every month from February through November 2023. We will hold our Annual Association Membership Meeting on the fourth Thursday of October 2023. ARLEIGH BURKE CLASS UPDATE BY CAPT SETH MILLER, PMS400D

Now in its 38th year of production, the DDG 51 Arleigh Burke-class Destroyer program is one of the Navy's longest-running production lines and continues to deliver capability and capacity to the Fleet. With the delivery of the future USS Lenah Sutcliffe Higbee (DDG 123) in November 2022, 71 DDG 51-class ships have been delivered to the Fleet. Serial production of Arleigh Burke-class destroyers continues with 18 ships under contract and 12 ships in various stages of production. The future USS Carl M. Levin (DDG 120) will be the next ship to deliver in early 2023.

The Navy has accomplished several significant milestones in the past year and continues to work with industry partners to accelerate delivery of this critical capability to the Fleet. Since the program's most recent update in September 2021, the Navy has celebrated the following set of achievements:

In addition to these remarkable shipbuilding milestones,
Secretary of the Navy Carlos Del Toro named DDG 138
(future USS J. William Middendorf), DDG 139 (future

Secretary of the Navy Carlos Del Toro named DDG 138 (future USS J. William Middendorf), DDG 139 (future USS Telesforo Trinidad), and DDG 140 (future USS Thomas Gunning Kelley). On January 10, 2023 I had the honor of representing the program when the Secretary introduced the ship sponsors for DDG 139 at a small ceremony in the Rayburn House Office Building. The very next day, Secretary Del Toro surprised the Surface Navy Association audience by announcing the name of DDG 140 during his keynote address at the annual symposium.

In addition to ongoing progress on delivering the final few Flight IIA destroyers, the Program continues to make great strides on production and testing of the first Flight III destroyer, the future USS Jack H. Lucas (DDG 125). The ship completed an initial set of sea trials in December 2022 with plans for additional at-sea testing in early 2023 prior to delivery. The Navy plans to continue DDG 51 production through at least FY27 and Congress has provided multiyear procurement authority toward that end.

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE SURFACE NAVY UPDATE BY RICK EASTON AND ROB JOBRACK

Why does our Association have such a strong relationship with the National Museum of the Surface Navy (NMSN)?

The NMSN's mission is to tell the story of the Surface Navy's past, present and future. That story can't be told correctly without the history of Admiral Arleigh Burke and the ship that bears his name. Without the generational foundation set by Admiral Burke as Chief of Naval Operations and through his many exceptional career accomplishments, and the work that every Member of the Association has done in making DDG 51 and the Arleigh Burke Class successful, today's Surface Fleet would look far different. This important story that links both Admiral Burke and the ship with the NMSN is being developed right now and our Association has an opportunity to influence the way it is told.

The NMSN initial phase is scheduled to open on the Navy's 250th Birthday, October 13th, 2025, aboard the Battleship Iowa in the Port of Los Angeles, and includes plans for an exhibit on Admiral Burke.

Mr. Bran Ferren – an accomplished former leader of the

Disney Imagineers, and now a Museum, Command Center and Entertainment Center Master Designer — completed his initial design effort. The following artist concept drawings, on pages 6 to 8, depict the vision for the Museum. It starts with an aerial view of the Battleship Iowa, which will house the Museum, alongside a Veterans Park and Shoreside Visitors Welcome Center. Access to the ship is through a special Gangway/Tunnel depicting various Naval Heroes - note Admiral Arleigh Burke in the overhead, arriving in the ship on the "Landing Pad" which provides access to three different paths the Visitor can take — History, Today or Tomorrow. The Museum experience ends on the upper decks. Please let me know what you think.... The Museum Staff is looking for feedback!


